During the 1974 meeting of the New Mexico–West Texas Philosophical Society, Hubert Alexander raised a question about a more rigid method of selecting papers to be presented at our annual meetings, since after all our “sugar daddy” compositors (the Dean of the Graduate School and the International Center for Arid and Semi-Arid Studies at Texas Tech University) have set a finite limit of the number of pages they will compose for us. We may have to come to some means of selection (which presupposes an editorial board) sooner or later to be sure, but I honestly think that if the members *will limit* the number of pages to no more than ten type-written pages, including footnotes, that our benefactors will live up to their name and remain benevolent.

We might keep the restrictions on space in mind, while at the same time we could plan a second issue (I have mentioned this before) of, say, *The New Mexico–West Texas Journal of Philosophy* consisting of articles refereed by a board of editors. Initial publication would be restricted as to the number of copies to be issued in much the same way as the current *Proceedings*.

I beg everyone’s pardon in once more bringing up this matter and promise not to do so again, unless, of course I do so.
